Blending Learning Experience in NTSS

As part of MOE's 'Learn for Life' movement and a move to normalise Home-Based Learning (HBL) as a regular feature of school life, NTSS started on the Blended Learning journey in Term 2 and 3, 2021. Teachers designed and implemented lessons which enabled students to learn independently or collaboratively, within or outside of curriculum. The affordances of technology were tapped on to make the lessons engaging and interactive. Through Blended Learning, NTSS students can grow to be self-directed learners who are future-ready and develop dispositions, skills and knowledge to succeed.

During the HBL days, one hour was set aside for Student-Initiated Learning (SIL) activities. These are some of the experiential activities that students engaged in:

Mathematics

Secondary One students carried out research on fun facts about the subject and presented their findings through a medium of their choice.

Applied Learning Programme

This year, two photography competitions were held in conjunction with Earth Day and National Day Commemoration. The competitions aimed to provide a platform for students to apply the knowledge and skills learnt during the Applied Learning Programme (ALP).

A product and portrait photography workshop was also held in Term 3 this year. A photography studio was set up in the ALP Room for students to learn about light and shadow, and how these affected the images. They also worked in groups to take on the roles of both the director and model, and experimented with angles and lighting to capture images that reflected their intent.

Enhanced Art Programme

The participants applied their learning from the masterclass to their own art-making tutorial for the West 1 Online Exhibition Website. They worked in groups to plan and create the art activity of their choice while taking into consideration their target audience, time required to complete the activity, as well as lighting and composition theories.

Gearing Up For Exams

To help Newtowners better prepare for their tests and examinations, all students participated in the Gearing Up for Exams programme on 14 July 2021. Through a series of activities, students learnt what they could do to beat exam anxiety and stay positive in the face of challenges.

Newtowners watched a video of teachers sharing their experiences in overcoming examination anxiety when they were students. They learnt that exam anxiety is normal and while many may have experienced it, they have also managed it with various strategies.

Students then played a memory game which reinforced the message that it is important to start preparing for their examinations early, as relying on their short-term memory alone would be insufficient to recall unfamiliar content.

Lastly, students practised deep breathing techniques and learnt the importance of staying positive. They wrote notes of affirmation to themselves on a flower template which would serve as a handy and timely reminder for them to do their best while they prepare for their examinations.



Virtual Tour & Escape Room Experience

Undeterred by the current situation of not being able to go on excursions, a group of students took the chance to leap into a new challenge – their first ever Virtual Tour and Escape Room adventure! The students met online from home on 4 August 2021 after their lessons and with the guidance of 'Fun Empire', they began their journey.

The group was first challenged with puzzles involving iconic landmarks in Singapore before moving on to a virtual tour of the Former Ford Factory. Students were able to use the given clues to solve the puzzles, and worked together to unlock each room before eventually arriving at the final stage of the game.

Throughout this activity, students were challenged to work together within time constraints, and they did so with much enthusiasm. They were able to persevere throughout each challenge and managed to solve and unlock the stages together. Certainly a true display of our school's value of resilience!







Geographical Investigation at East Coast Park



Secondary Four Geography students participated in a geographical inquiry on Singapore's coastal environment at East Coast Park (ECP) on 28 April 2021. Geographical Investigation is an integral part of learning in the Humanities curriculum as it provides relevant and authentic contexts that enable students' understanding of geographical concepts and processes.

During the investigation, students made use of different fieldwork tools to collect relevant data onsite, measured the beach profile and conducted sediment analysis to find out if the sediment differed along the beach. They also measured wave frequency to establish the nature of waves at ECP.

Lastly, students drew field sketches of the coastal landscape and annotated key features of the physical environment. They were engaged, enthusiastic and certainly benefited from the authentic learning experience.





Student Leadership Training

The W1 Cluster Student Leadership Training is an annual programme which aims to equip primary school student leaders with leadership skills. This year, our Student Councillors (SCs) partnered with Nan Hua High School's CareForce in the planning and execution of the event.

With the theme of "Among Us", the SCs and Care Ambassadors met virtually and prepared for training, with the hope of nurturing the younger student leaders to be caring and to have effective communication skills.

One of the planners, Grace Lim En Hui (3E1), shared, "We focussed on making the project a success. Through the collaboration, we learnt best practices from each other."

On 21 May 2021, 70 students from Clementi Primary, Nan Hua Primary, Qifa Primary and Yuhua Primary attended the virtual training over Zoom. The SCs conducted three games to impart the skills of critical thinking and effective communication. To build resilience, each game had an "imposter" who was tasked to confuse and sabotage the morale of the group.

Through much fun and laughter, our SCs effectively enriched the young ones and made the virtual event a success!

thINK Writing Mentorship Programme

A collaboration between our school and the National University of Singapore under the University Scholars Programme (USP), thINK aims to impact critical writing and thinking skills of selected Secondary Three students who have displayed a strong command of the language. The programme strives to broaden our students' knowledge beyond their classrooms while providing them the opportunity to hone their expository writing skills.

The students had discussions with the objective of widening perspectives and the USP mentors worked closely with each of their mentees to produce an expository essay. During the four sessions in Term 3, 2021, mentors guided their mentees through the process of planning, researching, writing and refining.



Besides delivering the final essay, this programme also inspired the students to be confident and discerning writers.

Speech Enrichment Workshop

On 4 August 2021, selected students from Secondary One to Three participated in a Speech Enrichment Workshop. Even though the workshop was held over Zoom, it did not dampen the spirits of the participants who erupted occasionally into boisterous laughter at the responses of their school mates. They actively contributed to group discussions and participated enthusiastically throughout the programme.



The students learnt techniques of voice projection as well as strategies that would help them give an engaging presentation. The workshop culminated in an insightful application of these strategies that helped students to be more sensitive to the purpose, audience and context of their presentation.

Secondary Three Camp

Held in school during the 2021 September school holidays, the Secondary Three Camp was an invaluable experience for the cohort as their teamwork, communication skills and ability to think out of the box were put to the test.

Through activities such as the Outdoor Cooking Challenge, students learnt about planning and decision-making as a team and exercised their creativity with limited resources. Essential outdoor skills such as tent pitching and fire starting with raw materials were also taught during the camp.

Over the two days, the students were able to bond with their classmates and teachers.







Inter-class Obstacle Challenge

The Inter-Class Obstacle Challenge in Term 2 was a new initiative in place of the annual Sports Carnival which could not be carried out due to the COVID-19 situation. The event aimed to provide students with an opportunity to apply their Physical Education (PE) skills and knowledge, inculcate positive values, demonstrate teamwork and overcome challenges with resilience.

The event comprised two segments: Station Challenges and the Obstacle Team Challenge.

The atmosphere was lively and energising as each team strove to bring glory to its class. The strong teamwork and positive sportsmanship displayed by students was an exhilarating sight to see. The help and support from the PE and Sports Ambassadors also contributed to the success of the event.

William Hindlet Longzhihao (4E2) commented that the event was fun, interesting, and unconventional. He thought that every challenge posed a different twist which required good strategies and teamwork.

J. Darren Sham (1N5) also learnt the importance of not giving up and persevering through pressurising and difficult moments in order to complete the various obstacles and tasks.

Racial Harmony Day

Newtowners commemorated Racial Harmony Day on 21 July 2021. In line with the theme "Common Spaces, Connected Communities", students were led to reflect on how they could practise cultural sensitivity in hawker centres in order to make the common space an inclusive place for all.

Niki Gollent, National Education Ambassador of 3E1, also shared how we each play an important role in preserving and strengthening harmony among different races and religions in Singapore. He pointed out that if racial stereotypes and unhealthy perceptions were left unchecked, it could lead to misunderstandings or conflicts among Singaporeans. His sharing reinforced the importance of practising cultural sensitivity in shared spaces, including school, which is a common space shared by students and staff of different backgrounds.

National Day Celebrations

Starting from Term 2, the National Day curricular engagement efforts led students to discover and celebrate the contributions of our forefathers and Singaporeans through the Secondary One English Language Research Project, Secondary Two Historical Investigation and Secondary Three Social Studies Issue Investigation.

Students were also encouraged to reflect on what makes Singapore "home" through the National Day Photography Competition in July.



Our commemoration culminated in a vibrant celebration on 6 August 2021 with a video on "Our Singapore Story" featuring our students' reflections on building a stronger Singaporean society and a pre-recorded medley of National Day songs performed by teachers. 
